A **Bidder Number is required.** Register at the Auction Table.
Use INK to bid.

Bid Form: Each bid form has several **pre-assigned** price levels. The number of open lines matches the number of *seats/offers* for an item. *Example:* A GIFT CARD bid form has **one** line per price level--there can only be **one** winner. A DINNER bid form with **six** seats has **six** open lines at *each* price level.

For Couples: If you *both* want an item with multiple *seats/offers*, write your Bidder number on **two** lines.
No ditto marks please!

Buy It Now: When you bid at this highest level, you are guaranteed to win. When all lines in the *Buy It Now* price level are full, the item is Sold Out.

Monitor your bids after they are made. The *Bid Monitors'* job is to make sure the **Number of Bids** anywhere on the bid sheet does not exceed the **Number of Places** available. Higher bids *may* cancel out lower bids, depending on *how many* bids have been placed.

If a Bid Monitor has crossed out your Bidder Number, you have been **outbid**. You may always bid again in a higher price level if the item is not Sold Out.

Auctions will **close** about 3 p.m. for **Articles, Pies, and the Gift Card** so the winners can be notified. Winners will be asked to sign for it before they take it home.

Check Out: *There is **No Check out*** at the Auction.
Payments **cannot** be accepted.

Winners will be notified later with...

- A printed *Bidder Statement* that shows what items you won and the amount you owe.

Pay... (CHANGES from last year)

- By cash or check, (no credit cards) at Mesquite Madness Table on January 21 and January 28.

OR

- Use the **Online Giving to MVUU** button on the *MVUU.org* website. Accepts credit cards or your personal *PayPal* account. (2.2% fee).
- MVUU incurs fees for credit card payments. Consider adding that fee amount to your Balance Due.

Donors will receive...

- A printed *Donor Statement* which includes the Sold Prices
and
- A list of the Winners to your Event(s) with their contact information.

Please...If you win a bid but can't attend the event, contact the host, then **donate** your spot to another or ask our Office Administrator to do so. No refunds can be given.
