We have found our new building and transformed it into our new home with careful attention. We have newfound strength and collaboration with the Baja 4. We are rebuilding our Religious Education program. And, at a time when we could have acted from fear, we acted on faith: we learned new technologies, we made space for change, and we kept showing up for each other.

And, the anticipatory excitement surrounding preparations for the opening of our new church building fills us with joy and gratitude.

We are on the precipice of the next phase in our congregation's life: an upcoming settled minister search, budding multi-generational programming, impactful justice programs, and life-sustaining ministries. All, of course, within a new building we adore and an online community we have grown to love. We have not only survived, in many ways, we have thrived.

Our Visions for Next Year

So, what would it mean to "grow our love"? What are the ministries, programs, activities, and offerings that make even *more* love possible in our community and world?

Budgets are moral documents: they tell us what we value and what matters most to us. Last year's (2020-2021) budget funded our support for each other this year: it allowed us to raise all staff pay to the recommended UUA guidelines. It allowed us to keep all of our staff employed through the pandemic. These staff led us in shared ministries of music, pastoral care, justice, and religious (and technological!) education. This budget also helped us transform our building into a desert home and oasis.

For this year's (2021-2022) budget, we asked our MVUU leaders for their aspirations in the coming year. What are the resources they would need to do their ministries in MVUU, in our community, and world? What could we be if we had what we needed?

The visions of our MVUU leaders for 2021-2022 are inspiring:

- Our Board imagines more funding for leadership development, volunteer recognition, and funding our congregation's presence at local and national UU events, like General Assembly; we imagine a successful Settled Minister search as we celebrate the end of Rev. Samantha's ministry and we welcome a new leader to our community for our future
- Our **Justice Coordinating Committee** imagines making committed offerings to organizations we partner with like UUJAZ, while providing funding up front for new teams

- like Contigo (immigration justice) and our new Flowing Wells Neighborhood Schools Initiative
- Our Religious Exploration Program imagines growing in staff and staff time, including
 programs for families who have joined us this year, as well as funding innovative Adult
 Education programs committed to outreach and learning about the stories of our local
 community
- Our **Pastoral Care Team** imagines more funding for supporting each of us in times of grief and celebration with meals, cards, flowers, and events that help us all stay connected and cared for.
- Our Hospitality Team is imagining a future where we begin to gather in person again, possibly starting with outside gatherings; they imagine creating a welcoming environment in any season-- imagining BBQs, movie nights with popcorn on the patio, and Open Mic nights in the community
- Our Music and Worship Teams imagine, for the first time in a long time, the pleasure of a space that is entirely our own: crafting monthly sacred space with art and altars in the sanctuary, welcoming guest musicians and speakers to our stage, and offering innovative Sunday services that touch our hearts and inspire our minds.


The Ask

These aspirations of our staff and our leaders invite each of us to consider our role in growing this community. This year, inspired by their aspirations, we are proposing a bold budget of \$323,000. This is an increase of \$60,000 from our previous year's budget.

To meet this goal, we are inviting you to do two things:

1. Consider Making a "Fair Share Giving" Pledge: To meet this goal, we are inviting each of us to consider a "Fair Share Giving" pledge-- a pledge based on your annual adjusted income or annual spending, typically within 2%-10% of your adjusted income. A guide to what your "MVUU Fair Share Giving" pledge might be is included in this Stewardship packet. If this pledge is not possible for you, we invite you to consider an increase in your pledge giving that is meaningful to you.

2. Consider Your Role in Growing Love at MVUU: Please consider taking time to sit with what this community has meant in your life, and what you would like it to mean in your



life going forward.

- How has this community cared for and sustained you?
- How have you been part of caring for and sustaining others in our community?
- What love do you want to see grow among us and beyond us?
- How do you want to be part of growing that love?

We hope your meeting with your visiting Steward is a time of connection to reflect on these questions together. We hope that the financial contribution you make to this year's campaign is meaningful to you—that it inspires you as a member or friend in this community and that you feel your investment in our shared future deepen.

We are grateful for how you have shown up for us this year. We hope you have felt cared for.

Now: let's grow this love we have found, together.
